This is most certainly true.

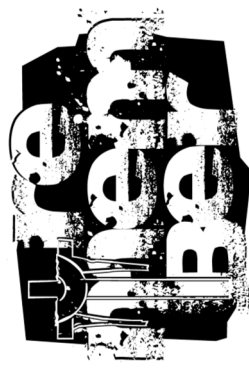
